





## **CMG WITHDRAWS FROM NPM**

At a recent meeting of the Church Musicians' Guild (CMG) Board, we discussed the benefits and detriments of having the CMG remain a local chapter of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM), based on several changes NPM has recently implemented. After thorough examination, we voted to withdraw from NPM. We remain an autonomous organization dedicated to serving the needs of pastoral musicians in our diocese.



One of the most concerning mandates from NPM was that all our CMG members would be required to join NPM. Currently, only a very small number belong to the national organization. You would have to complete their membership form (which would give you membership in both NPM and CMG) and pay a larger membership fee (their "standard membership" is \$119). You could not remain as only a local member. In addition, we could not collect dues locally, but would be allocated a small percentage from the national dues. Even if every current CMG member joined NPM, our budget would still be cut to about a third of our previous amount. And we fear that many of our members would not join NPM, resulting in even worse funding for us.



Your Guild operates on a tight budget. The Board of Directors are all volunteers, and we have no overhead costs. All of your dues remain here and go directly into programs, events and activities we find relevant and beneficial to our members. We strive to put your dues to the best use while providing a variety of opportunities to grow as church musicians. We feel strongly that we have made the right decision.

If you have any ideas for programs, contact a Board member. If you have expertise you'd like to share, consider joining the Board. We are always looking to expand our offerings and welcome your input. We are excited to be moving forward and thank you for your continued support!

## **BOOK ON CMG HISTORY PUBLISHED**

THE CHURCH MUSICIANS GUILD OF BUFFALO; FROM CATHOLIC CHOIRMASTERS TO CHURCH MUSICIANS: 1946 - 2021.

This has been a project in the making for five years. I am fortunate that I got it done when I did as my major source of information, the library of Christ the King Seminary, is now closed.

In the book, I trace the development of liturgical music formation beginning with the Catholic Normal School in Wisconsin where Leo Roy studied under the well known John Singenberger. The musician teacher brought the principles of Cecilianism from Europe to the middle west.


Leo worked in two parishes in the Buffalo diocese: Saint Mary, Swormville and Saint Mary of the Assumption in Lancaster. Leo's wife Magdelena and four daughters were organists in various churches; Cecilia Roy Kenny is the most well known of the children.

The book connects John Singenberger to Leo Roy to the next generation of children with Cecilia's alliance with Msgr. Henry Kawalec, Sr. Mary Grace Ryan and Msgr. Paul Eberz. The rest, as they say...."is history!"

Few remember that Cecilia Kenny was a pioneer aviator at a time when women were not involved in that kind of activity. The early death of her husband caused the cessation of her flying career and eventually she had to start work full time at Saint Joseph's Old Cathedral.

Writing my first book was fraught with difficulties. A few individuals refused to be interviewed. I had never written a book before and never met my publisher. All was done online. Some information had to be procured through the interlibrary loan system.

There are some typos of names and some photographs did not appear as I had hoped. However, there is some really good information here. I have drawn connections to illustrate the unusual history of liturgical music in our diocese. How many dioceses were able to produce a diocesan hymnal such as Cantate Omnes? Cecilia's sisters helped to put the book together in 1952. It sold over 100,000 copies.



The book reveals the changes in the guild after Vatican II in response to more diversified ministries. In 1976, the guild changed its name and the name of the newsletter to welcome guitarists and non traditional music ministers into the fold. The text also discusses Buffalo natives who earned a national profile in liturgical music such as Bishop Edward Grosz, Sr. Judith Kubicki and Dr. James Kosnik.

I hope you will consider purchasing a copy of the book. It is available on amazon.com for \$16.95. The book was subsided by the author, but I do receive some money from each book to help me to recoup the cost.

The text has been accepted by the Library of Congress, Buffalo History Museum, University of Notre Dame, Catholic University of America and Buffalo and Erie County Library.

Our illustrious history has been preserved for generations to come. Learn about it and respect it. More than that, share the story of the development of the guild with others.
